



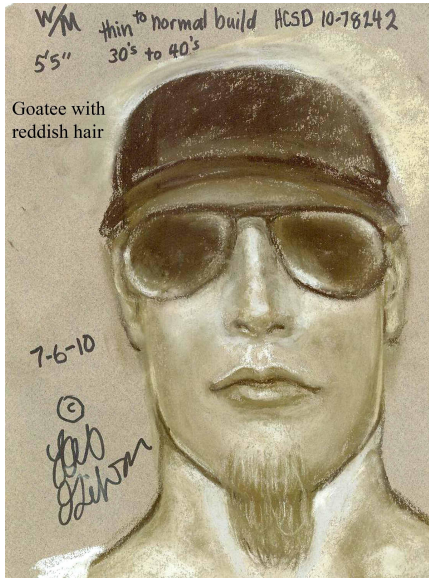

## Crime Stoppers News Release



### **WHAT: Composite Sketch Released in Road Rage Incident**

Crime Stoppers and the Investigators Harris County Sheriff's Office are seeking the public's assistance with any information on the identification of a suspect wanted in the Saturday June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2010 road rage incident that turned into an Aggravated Assault.

On Saturday June 5<sup>th</sup> at around 6:30 in the evening the victim and his nine year old son were driving down West FM 1960 near Aldine Westfield. The victim was stopped at the red light at Treaschwig when his car stalled. The suspect, who was in a truck behind the victim, became angry when the victim did not move quickly enough when the light turned green. Once the victim's car started he drove off and the suspect sped up and cut him off. The victim was concerned about the suspect's actions so he pulled into the Whataburger parking lot in the 2600 block of West FM 1960. The suspect followed him into the parking lot, got out of his car and approached the victim. He pulled out a knife and cut the victim across his right arm and stomach causing severe injuries. The suspect fled the scene and the victim was transported by ambulance to Hermann Hospital.

The suspect is described as a 30 to 40 year old white male with a thin build. He has reddish hair and a goatee. He is around 5'5" tall and was wearing sunglasses, a baseball cap, a white muscle shirt and long baggy shorts. He was driving a black or dark blue colored single cab step side pickup truck, possibly a Dodge, with faded paint. In the truck with him was a white female with short dark hair and a young child.

Attached is a composite sketch of the suspect.
