WHAT: Pizza Delivery Turns into Aggravated Robbery – Multiple Suspects Sought by Crime Stoppers

Crime Stoppers and investigators with the Harris County Sheriff's Office area searching for the suspects responsible for an aggravated robbery that took place in early January.

On Tuesday, January 3, 2012, at approximately 10:10 pm, a female victim was delivering a pizza to a residence located near the 15000 block of Mission Village. As she approached the residence, a male suspect appeared from the side of the house pointing a rifle at her. At the same time, the front door opened and two more black males appeared pointing a rifle and a pistol at the victim. She was forced inside the residence and led to the garage by one of the male suspects, while the other two suspects exited the residence. While inside the garage, the suspect began to inappropriately touch the victim. The victim begged the suspect not to hurt her. The lone suspect ordered the victim to count as he fled the residence. When the victim finally left the residence she discovered her vehicle had been rummaged through. Several of her personal items, including a debit card, were stolen.

A short time later, surveillance cameras at a gasoline station located near the 15000 block of Bellaire captured images of a maroon colored vehicle, possibly a Pontiac, pulling up to the gas pumps. Several males exited the vehicle and used the victim's stolen debit card to make unauthorized purchases. Images of three male suspects were captured inside the store. Attached is surveillance video of several male suspects.

The suspects in this case are described as Black males in their early 20's. One of the suspects using the victim's debit card appeared to be White or Hispanic, approximately 6'0" tall, wearing a red and yellow ball cap with "Houston" on the front, a gray hooded sweatshirt with "Taylor Game" and a large star on the back, and dark jeans.
