WHAT: Man Robbing ATM Customers

Crime Stoppers and Investigators with the Harris County Sheriff's Office are seeking the public's assistance in identifying a suspect who is robbing people while they use ATM's.

On Tuesday July 13th, 2010 a young woman drove up to the ATM at the Chase Bank located near the intersection of Spring Cypress and Tomball Parkway around 9:00 in the evening. As she was withdrawing money from the machine, a white male approached her car from behind. He walked up to her window, pointed a gun at her head and demanded money. He fled the scene on foot.

On Saturday July 17th, 2010 at around 10:00 in the evening a man was using the ATM at a Chase Bank located at 24191 Tomball Parkway when he was approached by a white male. The man pulled out a gun and pointed it at the victim's head and demanded his money. The suspect again fled on foot.

After an investigation it is believed that the same suspect is responsible for both robberies. The suspect is described as a 20-30 year old white male. He is between 5'10" to 6'1" tall and weighs around 130 to 150 pounds. At the time he was wearing dark colored clothes and had a mask over the lower portion of his face.

The suspect was captured on surveillance cameras at both locations. Attached are three pictures of the suspect.
